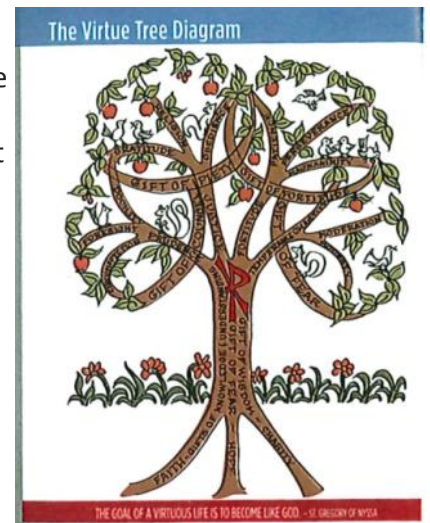

It feels like we've only just begun, but in reality, we're about 6 weeks away from the 2022-23 school year. The maintenance staff have been cleaning, polishing, waxing, painting, installing and fixing. Our teachers have attended professional learning in state and out of state as they are honing their teaching skills and faith development. Our safety team has retrained on active shooter responses and we've begun our recertification in CPR/first aid. We will be ready for the next school year and our overriding mission of bringing truth to our students. Truth does not change with the times. It is unaffected by opinion. We come to know truth through God and his creation. As Pope Benedict XVI proclaimed (CDF address Feb. 10, 2006) "The desire for truth is part of human nature itself." Our Catholic School is cognizant of its mission as a ministry of our parish designated to form children's minds, hearts and spirits using the Incarnation, the Trinity, the Paschal Mystery and the Eucharist to guide and strengthen us. God is with us in our human trials. God wants a relationship with us. Suffering strengthens us and fosters growth in our prayer life and the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian life. Along with our pursuit of strong academic instruction, we continue to instruct students in the goal of leading a virtuous life. We begin with the theological virtues of Faith, Hope and Charity infused by God at Baptism and move to the Cardinal Virtues, the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, and the Fruits of the Holy Spirit. We will begin the year focused on the Theological Virtue of Faith with the Cardinal Virtue of Prudence being taught in the components of a prudential act which are good counsel (ask & listen), good judgement (think) and command (act). We will follow with the virtues of circumspection (thinking before acting), docility (following directions; listening), and foresight (considering options, gathering information, making long and short term goals). We are looking forward to a terrific school year. The books and supplies are arriving daily. The teachers are beginning to meet to discuss the next year's plan. We've only just begun and we are excited for all there is still to do. Thank you for your support of our Catholic School. There is no better place to be.
