The purpose of the Men of St. Joseph is to instill holiness in men and facilitate spiritual leadership in family and community life."

Where: The St Dominic Chapter meets weekly on Wednesday mornings at 7:00am in the Murphy Center meeting rooms 1 & 2. The meetings last 1 hour. There is no cost to join. All adult men are invited to attend.

Why: What a different world it would be if more men dedicated themselves to holiness and embraced their role as their family's spiritual leader. What if your parish and community were full of men like this?
